RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Research energies are currently focused on several areas. I am continuing to work with the Windover materials, most actively on a strategy to improve the DNA extraction procedures and continued collection of osteometric and nonmetric information. This has extended to the continued development of a paleodemographic database on New World and Old World skeletal material with a substantial inventory of osteometric and dental metric data (n > 5000). Several possible funding sources for this project are under consideration. This has also led to an increasing interest in other early (pre-5000 14C years BP) populations from around the world. Japan is of special interest because of its archaeological diversity and significant wet site possibilities.

We are also pursuing several opportunities with respect to historic archaeology in Florida, specifically of the antebellum and postbellum periods - some with potential for bioarchaeological materials. We have

recently begun a series of projects applying Geoprobe (direct push technology) to soil sample extraction from archaeological sites spanning the Late Pleistocene to modern times. This technology has been applied to archaeological sites in Florida, Tennessee and Texas and represents a new research area.

The third largest (n=69) collection of this antiquity in North America (Windover is #1, Carrier Mills, Illinois is No. 2). Funded analysis of Buckeye Knoll will involve extensive bioarchaeological analysis, comparative data collection and mtDNA, isotopic analysis and further radiocarbon dating (funded fall 2003 - fall 2004: \$150,000) through Coastal Environments and the US Army Corp. Of Engineers - Galveston District.
